





ESCO United ended the January transfer window beaming with confidence of returning the MTN 2021/22 league campaign.

The opening of the January transfer window saw the champions release legendary goal scorer, Jesse Were after spending five years at ZESCO United.

Zimbabwean international midfielder, Tafadzwa Rusike also left the league defending champions after his contract came to an end.

The departure of Rusike and Were opened doors for ZESCO United to make additions to the squad.

Angolan and Trident Football Club striker, Pedro Miguel made a dream move to the league champions.

Miguel penned a 2-year contract agreement with the Zambian Super League defending champions and is expected to play a huge role in leading the club's frontline.

The biggest coup of this window for ZESCO United was the signing of Zambian International attacking Midfielder, Collins Sikombe.

Sikombe is one of those talents that slipped through the ZESCO United system having found his feet at ZESCO Malaiti Rangers a few years ago.

He has been one of the rising stars of the Zambian game in the last five-years becoming a star player at Napsa Stars before being prized away to Lusaka Dynamos.

ZESCO United will be hoping that he brings the same character and ingredients to the squad that made him a star player at both Napsa Stars and

Lusaka Dynamos.

The coming of Sikombe was followed by the return of former 2017 U-20 Africa Cup of Nations winning defender Shemy Mayembe from Minaji football club.

ZESCO United further captured the signature of former City of Lusaka attacking midfielder, Francis Banda.

Banda who signed a 3-year contract for the MTN league defending champions is expected to bring speed and creativity in the middle of the park.

he month of February started with the departure of ZESCO United Chief Executive Officer, Richard Kabwe Mulenga.

Mulenga left his post after serving at the helm of the Zambian Super League giants for 4-years, managing to steer the club to three league titles, one Absa Cup trophy and one Charity honour.

ambia may have failed to qualify for the CAF Africa Cup of Nations tournament for a third consecutive time. This misfortune however, didn't stop the country from playing a critical role in the successful hosting of the continents most coveted competition.

The 2021 TotalEnergies Africa Cup of Nations held in the Central African Country, Cameroun was home to several CAF delegates selected from different parts of the World to help manage the event successfully.

The ZESCO United Media Officer was also on show during the Round of 16 match and quarter final game between Nigeria and Tunisia and Tunisia against Burkina Faso respectively.

imothy Bowa is a member of the current ZESCO United Football Club Executive Committee who has great passion for soccer development in Zambia besides his rich Basketball playing and coaching skills.

Bowa who also trades as ZESCO Limited Industrial Relations Manager, has seen his professional lenses widen from keeping tabs on the welfare of ZESCO Limited employees to making critical decisions off the pitch.

Football has evolved over the years with the games administrators often required to understand the intricacies of the game.

As an executive member, Bowa's resolution to expand his knowledge in the game on and off the pitch is undeterred.

Last year, August 2021, the club executive member, completed and attained the FAZ 'E' License coaching course.

The aim of the 'E' Licence coaching program was to prepare coaches for the CAF License Course; to share experiences in order to influence the development of players; to help improve the football standards in Zambia; to help trainees understand how football knowledge and skills are supposed

to be taught to the footballers from the Coach's point of view.

Bowa described the training as enriching especially in understanding how the game of football is played.

"This training has enlightened me to understand the science of football, how it is supposed to be played with the aim to win games. You understand the philosophy behind coaching and training.


The ZESCO United executive member hopes to contribute effectively to the development of football in Zambia.

"After this, one wants to contribute to the game especially in ensuring that coaches have the right football knowledge and skills at all levels of football. Secondly, provide football analytical services to Zambian Coaches to help coaches develop football in Zambia."

With the hope of one day obtaining a CAF coaching course, Bowa is currently critically studying the science of football through various forms of literature, platforms and helping some academy teams in Lusaka.







ith only 10 games to go before the MTN Zambia Super League concludes, the race for the top slot remains undecided.

Red Arrows, Zambia's envoy in this season CAF Confederations Cup, have stubbornly maintained their grasp at the summit of the league table amassing 46 points from 24 games thus far played.

Zambia National Service sponsored Green Eagles continues to make their case known that they are in the race for the title having uprooted ZESCO United from second position, collecting 42 points from 24 games so far.

League defending champions, ZESCO United have had a rollercoaster of a season in which consistency in getting results has frustrated their hopes of running away with the title like they did last season.

ZESCO United currently sit in 3rd position having accumulated 41 points from 24 games.

The Zambia Army sponsored Green Buffaloes is another surprise side which like the wild beast, has repeatedly refused to surrender its turf among the top boys, gaining 38 points from 24 games.

As the Zambian Super League slowly approaches its final hour, ZESCO United have in the recent past found the oomph that carried them to a 9th league title last season.

ZESCO United have in the last six matches won four games, drew one and lost one. A 2-0 loss to Kansanshi Dynamos in the MTN week 23 match destabilized the teams title ambitions following their backto-back games without a loss.

Undeterred from the Kansanshi Dynamos







loss, ZESCO United came back floating like butterfly when they faced Nkana the MTN Super League week 23 fixture played at the Levy Mwanawasa stadium.

A highly hyped and hotly contested fixture saw ZESCO United dispatch the Wusakile Boys with a 2-1 victory which gave the champions high hopes of winning a 10th league title.

ZESCO United will be hoping to mount consecutive victories and hope to dislodge Arrows from the summit of the league table.
